Home to a trail of boutique food factories and eateries, this little laneway is a foodie haven. Indulge in divine Wellington Chocolate Factory, the fresh flavours of Six Barrel Soda and Fix and Fogg peanut butter sold from a cute little window.



Weta Studio Tours

Spend time in the company of hobbits, trolls and wizards, and discover Wellington's moviemaking magic on a tour of the award-winning **Weta Workshop.**



WWI exhibitions

Gallipoli: The scale of our war at Te Papa and The Great War Exhibition in the old Dominion Museum building are incredible exhibitions that provide an immersive and emotional journey through the stories of the First World War.



Cable Car

The bright red Wellington Cable Car is a bit of a classic. For just a few dollars, you can take the short ride on this historic vehicle from the heart of Lambton Quay up to the lookout, where you'll also find the Cable Car Museum, Space Place at Carter Observatory and the Wellington Botanic Garden.



10 Zealandia

Get up close and personal with a three-eyed prehistoric reptile, and New Zealand's native birds at nature reserve **Zealandia**. Catch a free shuttle to this ground-breaking eco-sanctuary from the Wellington i-SITE Visitor Information Centre or the top of the Cable Car.



ll Local brews

Quench your thirst at one of Wellington's craft breweries. Sample straight from the source at **Parrot Dog's** Vivian Street brewery, **Garage Project's** Aro Street cellar door, or Tuatara's bar **The Third Eye** on Karo Drive or their brewery in Kāpiti.

Whether you like your art in galleries, on the street, on the stage, or somewhere in between, Wellington is the place for a culture fix. From movie-making magic to award-winning museums, world-class performing arts and thought-provoking street art, you'll find plenty to inspire your creative spirit.





With more than 50 galleries and a trail of colourful street art and sculptures, Wellington is a feast for the eyes. Pay a visit to City Gallery Wellington, the New Zealand Portrait Gallery, Ngā Toi at Te Papa, PĀTAKA Art + Museum in Porirua or The Dowse in Hutt Valley for contemporary and classic art collections. Keep an eye out for Instagram-worthy sculptures around the city including the iconic Bucket Fountain, Solace in the Wind and the Wellington Writer's Walk.



Performing arts

Home to major national arts companies including the Royal New Zealand Ballet and the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra, as well as a vibrant arts scene, there's always a live performance on offer in Wellington. Enjoy theatre at BATS, Circa and Hannah Playhouse, or marvel at international productions and musical acts at St James Theatre and the Opera House. Wellington also hosts an array of fantastic festivals, including the biennial NZ Festival (23 Feb - 18 Mar 2018), and the World of WearableArt™ Awards Show (21 September - 8 October 2017).



Storytelling city

Journey through the past and present in Wellington's interactive museums and heritage sites. Discover New Zealand's stories at the Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa, learn our city's history at Wellington Museum and the Petone Settlers Museum, and get a glimpse of our government at work on a tour of the Beehive and Parliament.

Movie magic

Discover Oscar-winning magic right here in Wellington. Visit the wizards of Weta Workshop on a behind-thescenes tour of the workshop and Weta Cave, explore film locations on a Wellington movie tour, or sit back and enjoy a film at the grand Embassy Theatre, site of numerous red carpet premieres.

Bays and beaches


You're never far from a great beach or swimming spot in Wellington. Sink your toes into the golden sands of **Oriental Bay**, just a five minute walk from the city, enjoy a picnic lunch and a dip at **Scorching Bay**, watch the surfers ride the waves at **Lyall Bay** while you enjoy a coffee from **Spruce Goose** or **Maranui Café**, or venture north to the **Kāpiti Coast**, where you'll find 40km of unspoilt beaches.

Encounter wildlife

Thanks to the bush-covered hills and lush nature reserves, many native creatures call Wellington home. Spot tuatara, kiwi and weta on a tour of Zealandia, hang out with native birds on the Kāpiti Island nature reserve, or count the sunbathing seals on a Seal Coast Safari. Fancy more animal encounters? Take a trip to Wellington Zoo, or have a go feeding farm animals at Staglands Wildlife Reserve.

LOCAL TIP

"Take a walk to Red Rocks to see the seals from April to October. I love showing this off to visitors. So close to the city and yet a world away."




Fun on wheels



New Zealand tourism's official mark of quality assurance is the **Qualmark®**. All accommodation and tourism businesses with the **Qualmark®** logo have been independently assessed as professional and trustworthy.







Getting to and from Wellington Airport is simple. Taxis to the city will cost an average NZ\$35-45, or for a few dollars more ask the driver to take you on the scenic route around Wellington's bays.

You can also catch the **Airport Flyer**, an express bus service that operates between Wellington Airport, Wellington City and Lower Hutt. The Flyer departs the airport every 10 minutes at peak times (weekdays 6.30am - 9.00am and 2.00pm - 7.00pm), and approximately every 20 minutes at all other times. Fares to the city cost NZ\$9, while a trip to Hutt Valley will cost NZ\$12.

Plan your journey

You can easily plan your adventures at www.metlink.org.nz, which has a handy journey planner as well as timetable and fare information for public buses and trains.

Pick up a **Snapper** card from the Wellington i-SITE Visitor Information Centre for easy discounted travel throughout the city and suburbs. Snapper cards cost NZ\$10 and can be topped up for use on GO Wellington, Valley Flyer and Airport Flyer buses.



Spin your wheels

You can hire bikes from Fergs Kayaks and On Yer Bike, a popular way to explore the waterfront and bays. Switched On Bikes hire electric powered bikes and also offer guided tours of Wellington's top spots. For a fun way to explore Wellington, hire a quirky Crocodile Bike and ride around the scenic waterfront, or jump on a guided electric tuk tuk tour with Tuk Tuk Cartel.

Daytripping

For a great day trip, catch a bus or train to Hutt Valley, Wairarapa, Porirua or Kāpiti Coast, or take the East by West ferry across the harbour to Matiu Somes Island, Days Bay and Eastbourne. If you would prefer to let someone else lead the way, book a half or full day group tour, and explore the region and beyond. Have a chat to the team at the Wellington i-SITE Visitor Information Centre to see what the options are.

THE REGIONS

There are a number of day trips you can take from Wellington city. Just a short drive away, explore the great outdoors and taste the finest wine.

Kāpiti

Escape to Kāpiti for its unspoilt beaches and a warm coastal climate. Swim, sail and surf or just relax on the beach, take in the view and eat some local fish and chips. Go on a trip to an island nature reserve with Kāpiti Island Nature Tours and get up close to unique birdlife and native bush, or explore the coastal tracks. See page 24

Hutt Valley

From the Hutt River to the bush-clad hills, Hutt Valley is home to some of the region's best walking and mountain bike trails. The picturesque seaside townships of Petone and Eastbourne are also worth a visit, home to a collection of cafés and art galleries just a short drive or ferry ride from downtown Wellington. See page 16

Porirua

Tucked alongside two beautiful harbours and a rugged coastline, Porirua is a playground for watersport enthusiasts. Just 20 minutes north of Wellington, the region offers a bounty of beautiful walks and cycleways. For a cultural experience, discover contemporary New Zealand and Maori art at PĀTAKA Art + Museum.

Wairarapa

Get a taste for fine cuisine and relaxation at one of the country's top food and wine destinations, located just an hour north of Wellington by car or train. Spend a day cycling the country roads of Martinborough, pausing for tastings at some of the 20+ vineyards, or head to the charming village of Greytown for boutique shopping.

Rimutaka Cycle Trail

Spanning from Petone to Orongorongo, the Rimutaka Cycle Trail offers riders a stunning mix of New Zealand landscapes; from the coast, to the riverside, to bush-clad hills.

Fuel up for your ride in Petone, a foodie hot-spot, and follow the Hutt River Trail with swimming holes and picnic spots along green city fringes.

Stay the night in Upper Hutt and relax at one of several charming bed and breakfasts. Restock before leaving the city behind you to explore lush bush and historic rail trails.

Just 15 minutes up the road from Wellington City lies the beautiful Hutt Valley. Take time out to explore an outdoor haven filled with unexpected treasures and some of the region's best walking and mountain biking trails. Hop on a train, bus or ferry to explore seaside villages, boutique shopping strips and your next locally roasted coffee and local craft beer fix.

Start with a coffee and delicious brunch from Cake & Kitchen on Fergusson Drive in Upper Hutt and wander over to Main Street to discover unique boutique and independent stores including Created Homewares, Avison's Home & Giftware and Botanical Beauty Co.



AFTERNOON

Journey to Middle-earth in **Kaitoke Regional Park** and relive the magic of *The Lord of the Rings* Trilogy. Visit the set locations of Rivendell, Helm's Deep, Isengard and the Great River Anduin. Stop in at **Stansborough Mill** to see the makers of the movies' unique costumes and woven wool treasures.



EVENING

Head to Expressions Whirinaki Arts and Entertainment Centre for a taste of world-class visual arts and some of New Zealand's most notable theatre talent. Best of all – it's free to visit! Enjoy pre-show drinks and dinner at Limelight Café before catching a performance.





Discover the origins of the Wellington region and other New Zealand firsts at the **Petone Settlers Museum.** Take a stroll to **Jackson Street** for lunch at one of the many cafés in this vibrant heritage precinct full of boutique and specialty shops, bars and restaurants.



AFTERNOON

Check out contemporary art at the **Dowse Art Museum** with diverse and exciting exhibitions. Fill up your water bottle with the taste of pure New Zealand water, straight from the underground aquifer at the **Dowse Square** and **Te Puna Wai Ora**.



EVENING

You'll want to return for another bite of Jackson Street's street sized pantry of international flavours and gourmet food suppliers. Export yourself to Italy at La Bella Italia on Nevis Street and then cosy up for a wine together at Light House Cinema full of popular and festival film options.





Take the East By West (see page 84) ferry from the city to Wellington's playground by the sea in the Eastern Bays. Fuel up at beachfront cafés then hire a kayak, or cruise the bays by pedal power along the Pencarrow Coast to lighthouses at the entrance to Wellington Harbour including New Zealand's first, lit in 1859. Or simply let the water lap your feet at Days Bay or join the locals jumping off the wharf.



AFTERNOON

Hop across to Matiu/Somes Island wildlife sanctuary, once a quarantine station and a war-time prison, it is now home to tuataras and little blue penguins. The Weekend Harbour Explorer ferry cruise will take you here and other more Wellington ports - enjoy the on-board bar too!



EVENING

Wander the sunset-soaked bush trails and enjoy harbour vistas before relaxing for dinner at harbour-side **Cobar** or wood-fired pizzas at **The Pavilion.** Unwind in one of the many seaside cottages or homestays dotted around the bays.





Discover some of the region's most pristine lowland rainforests and wander through ancient rimu and rata forests where Wellington sources its water at **Kaitoke Regional Park.** With plenty of picnic spots and fantastic swimming holes to enjoy, stay for lunch and let the birdsong entertain you.



AFTERNOON

Test your handicap on the same courses played by some of the world's greatest golfers, including the **Royal Wellington** and **Boulcott's Farm**. Reward yourself with a stop at one of the local craft brewers' tasting rooms; **Kererū** in Upper Hutt and **Baylands** in Lower Hutt.



EVENING

Wind down with dinner at **Silverspoon** for a relaxed environment and exquisite food. Keep an eye out for **Panhead Custom Ales** on tap in bars and restaurants around the region- it's a locally brewed favourite!





The Akatarawa Valley feels like heading into another world. Nestled in the centre is **Staglands Wildlife Reserve,** an interactive wildlife park for all ages. With no barriers between you and the animals, this is a truly unique destination. Pack a picnic or relax at the café.



AFTERNOON

Take a step back in time at **Golder Cottage** or **The Blockhouse** early pioneer homes with colourful histories. Let the kids loose in the premier parks like **Maidstone Max**, **Avalon Park** and **Harcourt Park** - full of BBQ areas, lagoons, mini-putt, splash pools, flying foxes, skate parks, adventure playgrounds and more.



EVENING

Keep the heart pumping with **Daytona Raceway**, and challenge the family to **HangDog Indoor Rock Climbing** or **Strike Entertainment** bowling, laser strike and arcade. Finish off with the year-round **Frosty Spot** ice skating rink.





Breathe in the fresh forest air and make a game of searching out waterfalls nestled in lush native bush minutes away from the city in historic Birchville and Korokoro Dams and Percy's Scenic Reserve.

Venture further for a day walk to Rimutaka

Forest Park.



AFTERNOON

Wellington Adventures quad bike expeditions offer exhilarating rides over rugged coastline, spectacular hilltop views to the Turakirae Head seal colony. See majestic South Island mountain views from the back of a horse with Mac from Coastal Views Horse Treks.



EVENING

Relax with an early evening swim at the heated outdoor **Wainuiomata Summer Pool**, or entertain the whole family at **H20 Xtream Aquatic Centre.** Choose from wave pools, river rides, mini golf, spa pools, waterslides, and BBQs to use for your picnic dinner.



MUST DO'S



Experience New Zealand as it used to be before humans came, when birds were in charge on **Kāpiti Island**. Climb to the top and enjoy an incredible panoramic view from Marlborough Sounds to Taranaki, or stay overnight and go kiwi spotting.

See the largest private collection of rare and collectible cars in the Southern Hemisphere at **Southward Car Museum.**

Enjoy more than 200 shorts and 15 feature films at the **Māoriland Film Festival** held in venues around Ōtaki 15-19 March 2017.

Experience the spectacle of hundreds of kites on the beach at the **Ōtaki Kite Festival** 25-26 March 2017.

Climb the Paekākāriki Escarpment Track and Stairway to Heaven, considered one of the highlights of the Te Araroa national trail.

Follow in the footsteps of Tiger Woods and play golf at **Paraparaumu Beach Golf Club** – ranked as one of the best beach link courses in New Zealand.

HOW TO GET HERE





BY AIR: Wellington International Airport – one of New Zealand's largest airports – is an easy 15 minute drive from the city centre. Five airlines – Air New Zealand, Qantas, Jetstar, Virgin Australia and Singapore Airlines – fly in direct from Australia, and domestic services are plentiful. Bus, shuttle and taxi transfers into the city are readily available. You can also fly direct from Auckland into Kāpiti Coast Airport.



BY SEA: Wellington is a coastal gateway between the North and South islands, with regular ferry services taking passengers and vehicles across the Cook Strait. Two companies service the Strait - Interislander and Bluebridge.



BY ROAD: Wellington is located on two of New Zealand's major highways - State Highways 1 and 2. The Classic New Zealand Wine Trail is signposted by brown signs with grape icons.



BY TRAIN: KiwiRail Scenic Journeys operates a popular overland service between Auckland and Wellington. The journey takes approximately 12 hours.



BY CRUISE: The majority of cruise ships visiting Wellington berth at Aotea Quay. Aotea Quay is 1.3km from downtown Wellington – approximately a 20 minute walk. Transport options from the wharf include taxis, pre-booked shore excursion coaches and dedicated cruise shuttle buses.
